



Diane Wert Even-Tov

The lady who was everybody's friend has died. Diane Wert Even-Tov (nee Nunn) passed away suddenly on Monday, March 23 at Jefferson Hospital for Neuroscience. She was 77 and until the day of her death she was a healthy, active, vibrant person who used all her energy to help others and nurture her family.

Diane was born in Riverside, NJ, the daughter of William P. Nunn (deceased) and Minnie W. Nunn (nee Hoffman) who died in 1952 when Diane was 10 years old. Her father remarried in 1957 to Thelma Nunn (nee Hahn) and the family moved to Abington, PA. Diane graduated from Abington High School in 1961 where she met Bryan H. Wert, Sr. They married in 1964 and resided in the Hollywood section of Abington, PA where their two children were born. In 1970 they moved to Willow Grove where they would raise their family in a wonderful and close-knit neighborhood of which she was an anchor.

Having left the workforce upon the birth of her children, Diane returned to work once they began school. She worked in Public Relations as an editor and writer. As a result of her work-ethic, business acumen, language arts skills and magnetic personality, her work career flourished for over 20 years. A lover of learning, she enrolled in a paralegal class in the evening program at Penn State-Abington. She was immediately intrigued by Law and shifted career paths. In 2001, she took a job at the Law Office of Randal J. McDowell in Jenkintown, PA. She loved her work and co-workers. She was passionate about her job and had no plans to ever retire.

Diane's interests were wide and varied. She was an ardent environmentalist. On any given day, she could be found on the streets of Warrington, trash bag in hand, cleaning up an unkempt local street or walking the trails at Peace Valley Park. She was a "birder", an advocate for social causes, a voracious reader, an accomplished gardener, a CNN/KYW devotee and Philadelphia sports fan. She never missed an episode of Jeopardy. Proud and supportive of her children's education, she was active at Woodlawn Elementary School, the former Chair of the Parents' Committee at Ursinus College and a booster of Gettysburg College Athletics. Her Wednesday treks from Warrington to Havertown to spend time with her grandchildren, make dinner and help with anything necessary were legendary – "Grom" never missed a week, nor any important event in her children or

grandchildren's lives. Most of ALL, she was the matriarch of her family to whom she was tirelessly committed.

Diane's husband, Ori Even-Tov left her a widow on his death in 2003. She is survived by her companion of 15 years, John Lande, of Toms River, NJ. They had a very special relationship and were engaged for 12 years. She is also survived by her two children, Bryan H. Wert, Jr. (Cheryl), of Havertown, PA and Dana Wert Pivnichny of Sellersville, PA her beloved grandchildren John Hollowell "Jack" Wert, Henry Joseph Wert, and Kathryn Diane Wert, by her sister Phyllis Nunn Ruth (Earl) of Sellersville, PA and her brother Bernard Nunn (Sandy) of Mooresville, NC.

As per her request, her body has been donated to the Medical College at Thomas Jefferson University – she continues to give back even upon her passing.
